Jeffco Board of Education Election: Did you know we have a coordinated election here in Jefferson County on November 7th? This year's ballot includes the opportunity to vote for two new Jeffco Public
 Schools Board of Education members. In Jefferson County, Board of Education members serve a designated district, but all Jefferson County voters get to vote on all seats. That said, one of the vacancies is for District 3, serving Arvada, Wheat Ridge, and north-central Lakewood - which includes Excel Academy. We encourage all eligible citizens learn more about the candidates, register, and vote in the election. To help our families learn more about the candidates, the Jeffco Charter School Consortium, a group of charter school leaders and board members, is hosting a candidate forum. ## Hot Topics \& Burning Questions

Periodically, we will share some questions received by our front office staff and share the answers here so that all may benefit. This week's topic focuses on student safety.


Q: Why does Excel complete a background check each time a volunteer comes to the school?

We use the Raptor instant background check system for our day to day volunteers and others who come to the school to support with children. In order to assure equity, we run checks for all folks each time they come to the school. Volunteers can provide a valid driver's license (card or via the MyColorado app), passport, or government-issued ID. The process takes 1-2 minutes. We appreciate everyone's understanding and cooperation in keeping all of our students and staff safe.

## Q: What are expectations for chaperones who support field studies?

Chaperones are so valuable to our staff and students on field studies. They help in making a wonderful experience for the students in their group. Chaperone expectations are put forth for the safety and security for all students. The expectations of all chaperones include:

- Chaperones must keep all students in their group near them and in eye sight.
- Chaperones are expected to follow the directions of the teacher and/or facilitator on field studies.
- Chaperones are expected to follow school rules and be a model for our students.
- Siblings or other family members are not permitted on field studies.
- Parents and family members may not join the class at the destination for our field studies.
- No smoking or vaping is permitted.
- Chaperones are expected to ride the bus with the class unless otherwise specified.
- Chaperones should not be purchasing items or food for their child or other students on a field study.
- Chaperones must act as a good role model and not exhibit inappropriate behavior.


## Q: Should I be concerned if I see police at the school?

Our law enforcement partners and Jeffco Public Schools Safety \& Security officers come to our school for a variety of reasons. Officers come to share information, support school investigations when requested, follow up on Safe2Tell reports, observe emergency drills to make recommendations to improve safety, be a visible presence on campus when there might be something of concern happening in the broader community, and even just walk the halls to greet students and reinforce their familiarity with our school layout in case they ever need to respond to an emergency at Excel Academy. If there is ever a situation that families need to be made aware of, we or Jeffco Public Schools communications office will send information via School Messenger. This is one reason that it's important to keep your contact information and preferences updated in Infinite Campus.
