

Maker Activities in December = MAD Makerspace

Our Middle School Life Skills Elective 1 class is hosting all Excel Elementary School classes in our Maker Space for some winter MADness. We have planned, collected supplies and are presenting a range of maker crafts and activities to work on with each of our elementary classes during the month of December. We began with Kindergarten and first grade and will host each class up until winter break when we end with the 5th graders. Yet, another great way that our middle schoolers are connecting and building relationships with our K-5 students.







Report Cards & Standards-Based Grading Scale

Our first semester ends on December 15th. Our teachers will be finalizing grades and posting report cards that will be viewable in the Campus Parent Portal after the end of the semester. Elementary students will bring their report cards home on December 15th while Middle School report cards will come home after winter break (though they will be viewable in the Parent Portal at the end of the semester).

This is the first year that our entire school transitioned to standards-based grading. Teachers shared information about this at back-to-school events and through newsletters during the semester. We know that Campus had issues with the rounding, which caused concern among some students and families. Mrs. Heather Haberman, our 8th grade Science Teacher and our School Science Coordinator worked with Mrs. Julie Smith to figure out the solution and supported teachers in updating their grade book settings and algorithms on our November 17th Professional Development Day. All grades should be rounding correctly now. You can view our scale here as well as see it below. Thank you for your patience as we worked to get this rectified.

3.5 - 4 Exceeds Standard = 4

Demonstrates complete understanding AND deeper learning of concepts beyond the level taught.

2.5 - 3.4 <u>Meets Grade Level Standard = 3</u>

Equates to an 80 - 100% on a grade level assessment.

1.5-2.4 Progressing to Standard = 2

Equates to a 60 - 79% on a grade level assessment.

.95 - 1.4 Does Not Meet Standard = 1

Equates to **59% and below** on a grade level assessment.

0-.94 Insufficient Evidence = IE

Absent or not taking assessments.

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Hello, Sports Fans, this is the sport wrap up for the week of 11/27-12/2. The boys' basketball teams made their debut on Tuesday night before a packed house, and they did not disappoint. The "B" team started things off jumping out to a quick lead behind the sharpshooting of Hagen Heintz. The Eagles went into half time tied 16-16. The third period saw the Eagles down 28-25, only to storm back and tie the game 32-32 at the end of regulation play. Into overtime the Eagles went only to be outscored 4-0 and eventually


