#### Board Approves Schedule Shift Starting in 2024-25 School Year

Thank you for your recent feedback regarding the Instructional Leadership Team's proposed schedule shift. As representatives of the Excel community, we prioritize what will ultimately be best for our students. We value our unique position to gather community

feedback and make informed decisions.

After gathering feedback from parents and staff, we saw an even split in preference from parents, with the main concern being economical childcare solutions on Fridays. In contrast, the majority of our staff supports the change, believing it will enhance their teaching capabilities.

With the feedback in mind, the board has voted to implement the schedule change in the 2024-25 school year.

The considerations that ultimately led to the approval include:

- Through improved professional development, this shift aims to create the best learning environment for our students, which aligns with our mission and vision.
- Supports greater job satisfaction for our teachers and is anticipated to be a positive element of our school that will help us to recruit and retain great teachers.
- Similar approaches in other districts and schools have shown positive outcomes by improving the time in the classroom.

With the approval of this shift, there is also the expectation to provide economical solutions that would ease any burdens this shift presents. Ms. Vuolo and her team already have amazing ideas to ease the burden and now that the decision has been made, they will work to set up these solutions. Updates will be shared in the coming months.

Once again, we are thankful for this amazing community and feel fortunate to represent our families and advocate for what is best for our students. We look forward to seeing the positive impact of these changes.

### **UPDATES FROM THE SCHOOL**



#### **Dear Eagle Families**,

**Proposed Schedule Adjustments for 2024-25 School Year** One of the hallmarks of charter schools is the high level of involvement of guardians and staff in ensuring the success of the school. Included in this is the ability to have a voice in important decisions. In November, the Instructional Leadership Team brought forth a proposal to both adjust our school-day start times

and dismiss all students at 2:15 p.m. on Fridays not already designated as Professional Development Days. Between November 29th and January 16th, guardians and staff had the opportunity to provide feedback about the proposed adjustments via surveys and a Board of Directors Roundtable event. Thank you to all who took time to complete the surveys, participate in the Roundtable, ask questions, express concerns, and engage in discussions. Your input was central to the Board discussion at their January 23rd meeting, at which they voted to approve these adjustments, starting in August for the 2024-25 school year.

The time on Fridays will be designated for staff professional development, opportunities for collegial and vertical teaming and planning focused on curriculum, meetings focused on supporting student success, and time for our staff committees to meet. The earlier daily start time (8:10 a.m. for Middle School and 8:15 a.m. for Elementary) will both reduce the time impact of the Friday early dismissal as well as increase time for our Middle School students in their homeroom classrooms and for our elementary students to engage in their Morning Meeting activities.

We are already starting work to plan various neutral and low-cost options for our students on Friday afternoons in order to minimize impact on the families and our staff members who have children who attend Excel who indicated the 2:15 p.m. dismissal time would present a challenge. Some of the ideas we are vetting include:

- Encouraging volunteer-led group activities such as scouts, Destination Imagination, Navigators, etc. to meet on Fridays after school
- Providing opportunities for our Middle School students who are saving for extended field studies to provide low-cost activities with proceeds being applied to their trip funds
- Reaching out to the YMCA after-school program to see if they can add a low-cost Friday-only option for those who need care until the 3:30 p.m. regular dismissal time

Watch the Eagle Update in the coming months for more information as we finalize plans to augment our offerings on Friday afternoons during the upcoming 2024-25 school year.

#### **Required and recommended vaccines**

Students attending Colorado kindergarten – 12th grade schools for the 2024-25 school year: We know there's nothing more important than making sure your children stay healthy and learning all year long. Getting vaccinated is an important part of keeping kids in school, as it prevents them from catching and spreading diseases that can make them sick. The letter below includes important information about Colorado's school vaccine requirements, as well as other resources.

#### The Importance of Sleep

Sleep is extremely important for children and adults. We have been seeing some students coming into the health room tired and/or stating they did not get enough sleep or went to bed late. Sleep is needed to maintain good health and setting good sleep habits early is important. It is hard to learn in school when you are tired. Sleep is especially important for children due to the impact it has on both mental and physical development. Sleep is the time for restoration and for children's bodies to recharge and retain the

information they have learned throughout the day. According to the American academy of pediatrics children ages 3-5 need 10-13 hours of sleep, ages 6-12 need 9-12 hours, and ages 13 and over need 8-10 hours nightly. If your child is struggling with sleep, share this with your medical
