UPDATES FROM THE SCHOOL



Dear Eagle Families,

Whenever I ask students what the most important part of my job is, most answer without hesitation: "To keep everyone safe."

Students who do not feel safe are unable to learn. Staff who do not feel safe are challenged to readily connect and do their best work with students and colleagues. Nearly daily, we see stories in the media of violent acts carried out on school campuses across the nation. Whether one victim or dozens, each incident is truly a tragedy that brings life-long impacts to victims and those who love them as well as creates ripples through communities and

those who work in education. As a school leader, I take this responsibility to heart. Working in partnership with our school's leadership team and Board of Directors, we strive to leverage policies, procedures, and infrastructure that promotes safety in balance with a welcoming environment. While it's not appropriate to share all details of regarding our systems and

infrastructure, there are things that every member of our school community are part of to contribute to the overall safety of our school campus for students, staff, families, and visitors.

Raptor Visitor Management System: We endeavor to assure that our school, classrooms, and grounds are secure and that all people on site have a legitimate reason to be here and are signed in through the front office. One of the tools we use to support campus safety and security is the Raptor Visitor Management System.

A school visitor management system eliminates uncertainty and helps schools know precisely who is on campus. By scanning their ID, each visitor's information is screened against the sex offender registry in all 50 states and custom databases, including those with custody orders, expelled students, dismissed employees, and banned visitor status. The system instantly alerts school officials if a visitor is flagged as a security risk.

In the event that a visitor has no scan-able form of ID, the Raptor system allows for the manual entry of information (first name, last name, and date of birth) for screening purposes. Only the minimum data needed to accurately identify an entrant is collected (i.e., no address information, no Social Security number, no physical characteristics data—hair color, eye color, weight—is ever captured). No other data is collected from the ID, and a photocopy of the ID is not retained.

Once signed in, the system produces a badge that the visitor is expected to wear while on campus. This is a quick visual cue to our staff indicating that you completed the proper sign-in procedure and are permitted to be on campus. Visitors need to sign out by turning in their badge as they depart so that we can then sign them out. This step is crucial, as we must account for every person on our campus in the event of an emergency drill or situation.

We understand that completing the Raptor sign-in and sign-out process adds a bit of time when visiting Excel. We've invested in additional components to process two lines of people at time for school-day events, and continue to tweak our procedures to expedite the sign-in process without compromising safety.
