## UPDATES FROM THE SCHOOL

## Dear Eagle Families

Can you believe we are in the final quarter of the school year? Spring Break is aptly timed in to provide an opportunity for rest and rejuvenation before heading into the very busy final two months of school.

In addition to performances, field studies, extended trips for our 4th,
 5th, and 8th graders, spring sports, and our second Explorations Expo, students in 3rd through 8th grade will be completing our state assessments. While we at Excel Academy look to data to inform our instructional and curricular decision-making every year, this year holds even higher importance as this was our second year of using new curriculum in English language arts, science, and social studies. CMAS data provides the most comprehensive view we have of how effectively these resources are helping our students learn what they are expected to know based on the Colorado Academic Standards. We are also preparing to evaluate our math curriculum, as our current contract ends after the 2024-25 school year. Data from the CMAS math assessment will help inform this process and support us in evaluating other curricula moving forward. Most importantly, CMAS scores in achievement and growth contribute to teachers' understanding of each student, areas where they are strong, and areas where they could benefit from support. We are striving for $100 \%$ participation so that we have the most valid and reliable data possible for looking at how our students are doing, how our curricular resources are supporting learning, and where we as a school can focus for growth and improvement moving forward. In order to support our students in best showing what they know while also creating opportunities for some fun along the way, our school will be engaging in the following:

- All 3rd - 8th grade classes will participate in a kickoff assembly on April 1st where we will be highlighting different ways students shine: athletics, arts, academic competitions, scholarship, and positive character.
- We will be providing healthy snacks for all of our 3rd - 8th graders each morning of CMAS testing. Watch for more information on how families can contribute toward this effort.
- Because make-up testing has a far greater impact on student learning than the actual assessments, we are striving for $97 \%$ on-time attendance during the testing days. If we achieve this benchmark, middle school students who participated in CMAS will get to participate in shaving Coach Miller's head and elementary students who participated in CMAS will get to participate in taping Ms. Rothstein to a wall. I'm still thinking about something fun I could do with students to encourage strong attendance during CMAS. In the past l've dyed my hair blue and came to school with hair and makeup of the school mascot (and ended up needing to serve as a last-minute chaperone on a field trip!), led a dance party, sang karaoke with a colleague, got pelted with water balloons - stay tuned as I solicit ideas from students to see what might motivate them to get to school and be on time!

Please help us support students in doing their best by encouraging a good night's sleep, eating a nutritious breakfast (or getting breakfast at school), and getting to school on time. We will be administering CMAS assessments as follows:

- April 17-19: 5th and 8th Grade ONLY Science: 8:45-10:45 a.m.

We thank our 3rd - 8th grade families for scheduling appointments and vacations outside of our testing times to minimize the need for make-up testing.
