
## A Day Without Hate is coming on April 25th!

We are looking for a parent or community member who is passionate about the long term sustainability of Excel Academy. The board supports the "business" of the school and experience in law, finance, technology, facility planning, data analysis, strategic

planning, human resources, or education is beneficial, but not required.

#### WHAT DOES THE BOARD DO?

Some of our primary roles include financial oversight and decision-making relative to Excel's annual budget, establishing policies and procedures consistent with the schools mission and vision, long-term strategic planning, hiring and oversight of the school's Executive Director, school facilities development, and oversight and participation on school committees. <u>Click here</u> to learn more about charter schools and board governance.

#### WHAT IS THE COMMITMENT?

Board members are asked to prepare for and join the monthly board meetings and participate on one of the <u>school committees</u>. Additional commitments may include meeting with the PTO or education team and representing the board within our community. The time commitment is about 4-6 hours per month throughout the school year. Board terms are three years. **If elected, the term would extend from Fall 2024-Spring 2027.**
